| This text has 2 parts: Paul's for the Philippians' faithfulness to Paul and the gospel and his for their steady growth in faithfulness. In his prayer, Paul identified the essential ingredient enabling them to produce fruit and bring glory to God. He prayed that they might " the best things." They avoided distractions and stayed focused on the mission and mandate of Christ. They kept the thing the thing. |
| Paul praised their "partnership in the gospel from the 1st day until now." years had passed since the Philippian church began. During that time, wherever Paul went to spread the gospel, those Philippian believers pooled their limited and resources to support the mission. |
| Paul described their undistracted faithfulness in 2 Cor. 8:2-4 . This passage identifies some of the main things that distract us. (1) Severe We sense danger from the world around us and go into self-preservation mode. (2) Overflowing We have much and spend our time and money just enjoying our blessings. (3) Extreme The Philippians' severe financial situation didn't stop their support of the work, even giving their ability. |
